

What is Expanded Learning?

"Expanded learning" means before school, after school, summer or intersession learning programs that focus on developing the academic, social, emotional, and physical needs and interests of pupils through hands-on, engaging learning experiences.

Expanded Learning Opportunities

Our **Expanded Learning Program** utilizes family paid fees, After School Education and Safety (ASES), and Expanded Learning Opportunities Program (ELO-P) funds to create a single comprehensive program, serving Transitional Kindergarten through grade 6 students in SUSD.

30 Additional Days of 9 Hour Programming (for eligible families)

- Fall and Spring Break Camps
- Summer STEAM Camp plus BONUS Week
- Non Student Days Conference Week

CDP After School Expanded Learning

- Located at all 15 school sites
- Open from dismissal until 6:00 PM (including Minimum Days)
- Open all school days (180 days)
- Adult/Student Ratios (1:10 TK/K) and 1:20 (1st-6th)
- Staff
 - Site Supervisors (support 5 sites each)
 - Assistant Site Supervisor (on site leadership)
 - Activity Leaders (frontline staff)

CDP After School Expanded Learning: Daily Snapshot

Daily Schedule times vary by school site depending on dismissal time but the components are consistent

- Greeting, Check in, and Snack
- Outside Choice time
- Physical Fitness Component lead by Elevo/SUSD team
- Homework Assistance, Literacy/Math Activities
- Art/Science/ Curriculum/Enrichment Activities
- Enrichment Activities (i.e. Black Rocket/Woodcraft Rangers)
- Outside Choice activities
- Literacy: Storyline Online/Reading Time
- Choice Activity indoor Centers
- Clean up/Quiet Activity



CDP After School Expanded Learning: Active and Engaged Learning

- Currently we are offering an enrichment class for the 3rd-6th graders through Black Rocket Productions. This course provides an opportunity to learn about coding.
- Sports/Physical Fitness Enrichment: Starting next week all CDP students will participate in a 6 week Soccer Clinic where students focus on development of skills and teamwork.
- We are also offering an enrichment class for our TK-2nd graders through Woodcraft Rangers called Around the World where students learn about different cultures.







CDP After School Expanded Learning: Skill Building

Homework Assistance

 Students are encouraged to bring all homework/project questions to the Activity Leaders at CDP for support and assistance

Social Emotional Development

 Students are engaged in hands-on activities that promote social development, soft skills, leadership skills, and collaboration skills


Literacy, Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math Development:

- CDP staff facilitate our engaging curriculum as an extension of the students' learning
- Students are also able to explore and build on the learning skills and engage in the critical thinking process through enrichment classes



CDP After School Expanded Learning: Youth, Voice, and Leadership

- Student surveys are distributed yearly so that the students are able to provide valuable feedback regarding the program and activities offered and impact positive changes
- Students have the opportunity to assist in planning the activities based on their interests and collaborate with other peers
- The rules and expectations in the classroom are developed by receiving input from the students
- Leadership opportunities are available when students assist the Activity Leaders and help lead the activity with their peers
- Students are offered choices and opportunities for activities and they are able to select based on their interests
- Upper grade students have the opportunity to assist in the primary groups by providing leadership to their younger peers
- Primary students are often given the opportunity to be assigned for a "helper" for the day to enhance their leadership skills
- At Cedarcreek Elementary, once per month we offer leadership training opportunities for 3rd-6th graders facilitated by students from Academy of the Canyons! We are looking to expand this to more schools.





CDP After School Expanded Learning: What's Next?

SUCCESSES:

- Increased number of enrolled students
- Increased access for certain families by removing cost barrier
- Increased staffing and professional development for staff
- Purchased new 20 new chromebooks for each site
- Purchased a plethora of STEAM activities for each site
- Increased enrichment opportunities for students TK-6

NEXT STEPS:

- 24/25 Priority Enrollment for current CDP families opens February 14
- 20 additional chromebooks for each school site
- Continue with CDP enrichment for Fall and Spring within the after school program
